

Key points:

- FY23: total income of £273,325 resulting in a net surplus of £22,000 (FY22: £17,000)
- New 5 year National Lottery grant resuming of 1:1 support and TAS services (paused since January 2023)
- Other major funders include Children in Need, Comic Relief and Postcode Society Trust
- Continued expansion of all income streams commissioned services 12% of total income (10% in FY22)
- Reserves going forward to FY24 of c8.1 months (includes designated website funding of £17.3k), a very strong and sustainable position
- Looking ahead to new website and logo in FY24

Trauma & Attachment Service: Children & Young people Let's Get Creative


1-1 Specialist Parenting Support



59 families received one to one specialist support4 to 8 sessions per family


As always, we are quick to respond to families' needs and so we will continue to do the same.

We have learnt from Covid that one needs to be ready to respond quickly but also key is to listen to families, we will continue to do that whatever 2024 brings.






I am proud to work/volunteer for Parenting Special Children 14 responses




Strongly agree


I feel that PSC provides a supportive environment 14 responses
